Applicants must fill in the attached application form and mail it with a copy of their ID card or passport to the address summerschool@jus.unibs.it or fax it to +39 (030) 2989613. Applicants will be selected by a Committee appointed by the Faculty. Successful applicants will be notified.

Application deadline

30 June 2011 or later, subject to availability.

Tuition Fee, Registration

There will be no tuition fee for students registered at a University or a Law School (including PhD and Master students). A tuition fee of 200,00 euros is required to other applicants.

A limited number of scholarships (covering accommodation and meals) is available for foreign candidates, accepted to the program and registered at a non-Italian university. The University can provide a list of accommodations at low rates for all applicants.

Transport and facilities

Information to help students travel to and from Brescia will be available on the website of the Summer School. For students coming from abroad (Europe) the most suitable option is flying to Orio al Serio Airport (Milan-Bergamo) or Valerio Catullo Airport (Verona). Low cost companies fly to both airports, which are 45 minutes away by car from Brescia. Buses and coaches run between the airports and the town centre (close to the University and to the accommodations). For overseas students (US or other regions) the better solution is flying to Milano Malpensa Airport or Milano Linate Airport.
